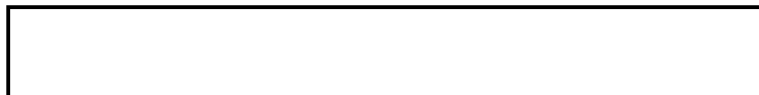



| <p>Hi [redacted]</p> <p>Sorry it's been awhile since I've sent you much in the way of news. A lot has happened the past few weeks that just skipped by. I'll fill you in - hope I'm not repeating myself on too many things.</p> <p>First of all, I regret that you have someone mean who is supposed to be your mentor in your [redacted] It's sad that [redacted] has to pick on you and others. We are currently finishing up the last of the AVA, and when that is gone, there's nothing to replace it with. I don't know what will happen to the research programs and hot suite work until we get a new lot. There are no approved lots currently available at BioPort.</p> <p>A couple of weeks ago all of the anthrax researchers here had a day-long meeting during which we presented our progress. [redacted] I decided to spice up the meeting with the use of a "flatulator" [redacted] It created quite a stir. [redacted] me and got up and went to the opposite end of the room. [redacted] was quite concerned that I might not be able to finish the meeting. In the afternoon, someone commented on some research by saying that some experiment was very anal-retentive, whereupon [redacted] chimed in, "That's not Bruce's problem today." It was most humorous for those of us that knew the secret.</p> <p>[redacted] has been having us have biweekly meetings on the rPA vaccine progress, and on August 29 I went to the Pentagon - first time there - to go to a meeting [redacted] on the vaccine. There is a real bag of worms with a new lot of rPA produced by the BDP (a private company) for NCI, who is under contract to USAMRIID. BDP signed a sub-contract with to produce the rPA for a human use vaccine Phase I trial. They were paid and they produced it. Now they are refusing to release it unless the Army pays some incredible sum of money for lawsuit indemnification (about \$200,000 per year for the next 50 years). The Army refuses to do that of course, and everything is in Limbo. The Army does not have a contract with BDP, so it can't force it to do anything. It can't sue NCI, since one federal agency can't sue another. If we don't get the rPA, we will have to go somewhere else, which will be a terrible pain. It will postpone all sorts of things. Plus, there is talk of going to an rPA produced in E. coli, which would mean that we would have to repeat a lot</p> | |

We've heard from different sources that the plane that crashed in Pennsylvania was headed for Fort Detrick, not USAMRIID, but the telecommunications center (to knock out East Coast communications). The pilot may have simply shut the plane down rather than turned it over to hijackers. The other possibility I've heard is that the plane may have been heading to Camp David or the Capitol. At any rate, it's all very sad, very tragic. Please take care of yourself. When you get a chance, please write a line or two - love hearing from you. [redacted] seems as if [redacted] has been feeling better lately. Hope so. It hurts me to see [redacted] in pain.

I did the opposite back then. I told the group that I was never bothered by any of them, and the psychiatrist said it was probably because the gangs probably thought (knew??) that I was crazy, and they stay away from crazy people.
